What happens now in the England Hockey League? [England Hockey]

Men's and Vitality Women's Premier Divisions

Across the first half of the season, each team played once against everyone else in the league to determine league placings before the winter break.

Those who finished in the top six will now contest a top tier, playing the other teams twice to determine who will be crowned this year's champions. In addition, the top two teams will also qualify for next season's Euro Hockey League competitions.

The teams who finished in the bottom five will contest a separate tier, also playing each other twice over the course of the next few weeks. Those who finish in the top three places in this mini-league will retain their Premier Division places for next season while the bottom two will be relegated to Division One North/South.

The teams contesting each division are as follows:

Men's Premier Division (top tier): Old Georgians, Wimbledon, Hampstead & Westminster, Surbiton, Holcombe, East Grinstead

Men's Premier Division (bottom tier): Oxted, Beeston, University of Durham, Brooklands MU, University of Exeter

Vitality Women's Premier Division (top tier): Hampstead & Westminster, East Grinstead, Surbiton, Wimbledon, Beeston, Clifton Robinsons

Vitality Women's Premier Division (bottom tier): University of Birmingham, Loughborough Students, Holcombe, Buckingham, Swansea

Dates for your diary - international hockey events in 2022 [England Hockey]

A new year is upon us and, after seeing international hockey return in abundance over the last 12 months, there's even more to look forward to in 2022.

England's senior men and women have a number of tournaments and fixtures to look forward to, with the latter building up to competing in their World Cup in July, where they will be aiming to win their first medal at the event since 2010.

Both teams will be then looking to secure more pieces of silverware at the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham just a couple of weeks later. Each side won bronze at the 2018 Games in Australia's Gold Coast but will be hoping to finish higher up on the podium in front of what promises to be an adoring home crowd.

England's women will also have plenty of home support when they contest the EuroHockey Championship Qualifiers in August. That event is taking place at Durham University's Maiden Castle, the first time that senior international hockey matches will be held in that region of the country.

This all follows on from both teams participating in their first <u>FIH Hockey Pro League</u> campaigns between February-June, as they take the place of Great Britain for the 2021/22 season. They start with a series of away fixtures before four big weekends of hockey are held in London in May and June. The first sets of visitors will be Canada and South Africa's men and China and Spain's women on 21-22 and 28-29 May. After the success of Big Stadium Hockey in 2019, the FIH Hockey Pro League will <u>return to Harlequins' Twickenham Stoop</u> again this year when England's double header against The Netherlands is hosted there on 4-5 June. Finally, both sides then play Belgium at Lee Valley Hockey and Tennis Centre in what promises to be a thrilling climax to the league.

The U21 teams are set to return to action in 2022 too, after the men couldn't take part in the Junior World Cup last year due to Covid-related travel restrictions while the women's event was postponed. Both teams are scheduled to compete in the Junior EuroHockey Championships in Belgium between 24-30 July, with the men hoping to repeat or even improve upon their stunning silver medal from 2019. The aforementioned Women's World Cup could also be re-arranged to be contested this year, although this is still very much TBC.

England's masters teams will also return to international action, with Nottingham playing host to the men's and women's O35s and O40s World Cups in August. The men's and women's O45s, O50s and O55s World Cups will be contested in South Africa in October before the men's O60s, O65s, O70s, O75s and O80s World Cups will take place in Japan.

PREMIER DIVISION ROUND-UPS [ENGLAND HOCKEY]

Vitality Women's Premier Division - weekend of 27th November

Surbiton ended Hampstead & Westminster's perfect start to the campaign with a brilliant win in the final round of Vitality Women's Premier Division action before the mid-season break.

Heading into the weekend, Hampstead & Westminster's record read nine matches, nine wins, but Surbiton – themselves also unbeaten this term – ended that streak with a 3-2 triumph.

Darcy Bourne gave the hosts a 1-0 lead from a penalty corner after just ten minutes before Georgie Twigg doubled the advantage in similar fashion eight minutes later.

Grace Balsdon's 33rd-minute strike pulled one back for Hampstead but when Bourne got her second goal with 43 minutes played, Surbiton were on the verge of victory.

The Kate Richardson-Walsh and Sarah Kelleher-coached side did fight back as Emily Douglas scored with eight minutes left but they couldn't find an equaliser as their winning run was ended at nine games.

Hampstead & Westminster remain top of the table on 27 points but Surbiton and East Grinstead are now just three points behind them heading into Christmas.

East Grinstead moved into that position as they impressively beat Clifton Robinsons 6-1.

The West Sussex side had their 14-match home unbeaten run ended by Surbiton last week but bounced back with three goals in each half.

Lydia McDonnell, Chloe Brown and Robyn Bentley all netted before half-time, with Bentley notching her second, the in-form Sophie Bray scoring once more and Eliza Wheeler finishing things off in the second 35 minutes.

Holly Munro's goal from a penalty corner had briefly reduced Clifton Robinsons' deficit to 3-1 but the hosts ultimately proved too prolific.

Clifton's place in the all-important top six was already secure before the weekend and they will join Hampstead & Westminster, East Grinstead, Surbiton, Wimbledon and Beeston on the right side of the split after Christmas.

Beeston ended the first half of the campaign on a negative note, however, as Loughborough Students recorded their third victory of the season with a 2-1 triumph.

Olivia Hamilton scored after four minutes and Izzy Petter doubled the Students' lead before half-time which meant that even though Mads Newitt's effort set up a grandstand finish, Loughborough left as victors.

Meanwhile, in the battle of the bottom two, winless Swansea's run stretched to ten games as they fell 4-1 to Holcombe.

Italy international Ivi Pessina scored twice, while Emma Bandurak and Candice Manuel also got themselves on the scoresheet for Holcombe, as Beth Wood grabbed Swansea's only goal.



Men's Premier Division - weekend of 27th November

Jamie Wallace was the hero for East Grinstead as his hat-trick sealed a 3-2 victory over Beeston to help the West Sussex side qualify for the top six in the Men's Premier Division.

East Grinstead went into the final weekend before the winter break in eighth place in the standings, knowing only a win would do to claim the last top six place.

They also needed fellow top six rivals Oxted to lose to Hampstead & Westminster if they were to usurp them in the league as a nerve-jangling final day played out in dramatic fashion.

Beeston, who were two points behind Oxted in seventh but with a better goal difference, landed the first blow in the sixth minute as Kai Aichinger scored from a penalty corner.

East Grinstead responded ten minutes later as Wallace levelled the scores from another penalty corner before he put the home side in front on 18 minutes.

The two sides went into the break level again after Beeston responded with an equaliser on 31 minutes, with Sam Apoola converting to set up a blockbuster second half.

But it was Wallace who rose to the occasion to secure the victory, striking home the winner on 61 minutes to ensure East Grinstead kept their top six qualification hopes alive.

And Oxted's 4-1 defeat to Hampstead & Westminster meant East Grinstead completed a remarkable turnaround, having only secured their first win of the season a fortnight ago.

Hampstead were already assured of their place in the top six but ensured they went into the mid-season break on a high thanks to a brace from Rupert Shipperley.

Matthew Guise-Brown had opened the scoring for the visitors at Oxted School from a penalty corner in the 16th minute before Josh Kelly doubled their advantage on the half-hour mark.

Shipperley put the result beyond doubt before the half-time interval with his first goal on 34 minutes, although Nick Giles gave Oxted hope with a penalty stroke on 54 minutes. Any thoughts of a comeback were put to bed on 67 minutes, though, as Shipperley struck again to seal a comfortable win and dash Oxted's hopes of a place in the top six. Elsewhere, Old Georgians overtook Wimbledon at the top of the standings going into the winter break as they defeated defending champions Surbiton 2-0 at St George's College.

Old Georgians went into the game on the back of three consecutive wins and took the lead after just eight minutes when Chris Griffiths found the target for the home side.

A second goal followed on 25 minutes through Lee Morton to put Old Georgians 2-0 up at the break and that was the way it stayed as the hosts saw the second half out.

With previous league leaders Wimbledon having already completed their ten matches ahead of this weekend, Old Georgians' ninth win of the season saw them move to the summit.

University of Exeter also picked up their first points of the season with a 3-3 draw with University of Durham, although it could have been even better after leading twice.

Charles Taylor put the home side ahead on 20 minutes, but Durham responded after the break with two goals in five minutes from Jakob Schmidt and Max Garner.

Rhys Bradshaw equalised for Exeter on 50 minutes before Louis Ridge put the hosts back in front again, only to be denied in the 70th minute by Schmidt's second goal from a penalty corner.

Vitality Women's Premier Division - weekend of 12th February

Wimbledon head to league leaders East Grinstead in fine fettle as two of the Vitality Women's Premier Division in-form sides meet on Saturday.

Wimbledon accrued their fourth win on the bounce after toppling Hampstead & Westminster last weekend and Saturday's match has the hallmarks of an entertaining, attacking affair.

However, the top flight will be missing England women's internationals, with the squad set to fly out to Argentina on Saturday for their FIH Hockey Pro League matches.

Last weekend's set of results in the 'Top 6' means that East Grinstead, Surbiton and Hampstead go into the weekend's action all level on points at the top of the league, with Wimbledon just four points behind.

Surbiton host Beeston while Hampstead will be looking to avert a run of two straight losses when they host Clifton Robinsons.

The bottom tier gets under way for the first time on Saturday.

With points carried over from the first half of the season, Swansea have it all to do to avoid relegation back to Division One.

The Welsh side host Holcombe, while second from bottom Buckingham are also in action at home when they take on University of Birmingham.

Men's Premier Division - weekend of 12th February

The men's Premier Division returns with three Saturday clashes under the lights as the 'Top 6' gets under way for the first time.

With points carried over from the winter break, Holcombe and East Grinstead both open up with home encounters as they bid to bridge the gap on the top four.

East Grinstead, who squeezed into the Top 6 on the final day in November, are at home on Saturday evening against Surbiton where they will be aiming to reverse October's 6-1 defeat at Saint Hill.

Meanwhile, Surbiton will be looking to overturn a run of three without a win outdoors during a rare dip in form before the Christmas break.

Holcombe, unbeaten in five, take on newly-crowned indoor champions Wimbledon, while Premier Division leaders Old Georgians return to the fold with a home clash against Hampstead & Westminster. Wimbledon, Old Georgians and H&W have all beaten just once this season as the race to Europe begins in earnest.

In the bottom tier of the Men's Premier Division, University of Exeter will need to hit the ground running on the opening matchday weekend as they bid to avoid relegation.

Exeter don't start until next weekend, while second from bottom Brooklands MU could make early inroads on those above them - the bottom two sides are automatically relegated this season - with victory over Beeston.

Oxted and University of Durham also meet on Saturday afternoon.
